Chairman: David Wood

Dave is an Electrical Design Engineer by Trade and runs a local engineering company in Worcester involved in the automotive and manufacturing industries. Having started watching the City in the 70s, and reconnecting when his children started watching football, Dave has been attending ever since. Dave has been involved in the plans for a new ground since its inception and hopes to continue to assist bringing City home back Worcester. Dave is one of three Trust representatives on the Football Club Board.



Vice-Chairman: Julian Pugh

Julian has supported Worcester City since the 70s. He was the Programme Editor for more than a decade and was Co-author of the Official History of Worcester City FC book, published in 2003. Julian has also been involved with the Supporters' Trust for over a decade. Julian has worked in local government for many years and his background is in governance and administration.



Trust Secretary: Lyndon Roberts

Lyndon runs a sports consultancy working with professional football clubs and sports governing bodies on the subject of inclusion. Board Member: Richard Widdowson

Board Member: Bosko Medakovic
